Information for Applicants Public Stock Grid & Gate Permit

Installation of a Public Stock Grid & Gate (PSGG) is for the benefit of an owner or occupant of the land which abuts the road and is required to be installed in accordance with the provisions of the Roads Act 1993, the Roads Regulation 2008, and Council's design standards. Council will receive PSGG Applications from an owner or occupant (owner's consent is required in writing) of the land through which an unfenced public road passes for erection of a grid and adjacent gate at any place which the road intersects a boundary fence. If the subject road is a Roads & Maritime Services (RMS) classified road, Council will be seeking the concurrence of the RMS to the installation. Please read the relevant parts of the Roads Act 1993 and the Roads Regulation 2008. The latest version of this legislation may be viewed through the following links:

It is Council's objective to restrict the installation of a grid & gate to minor roads where traffic volumes are assessed at less than 50 vehicles per day. Council also requires grids to be of steel construction on concrete abutments/footings. Council's specification SD106 also shows how a Category 1 grid and gate installation should look when installed.

A 'Public Gate' comprises both a stock grid and a gate. A stock grid shall be located on the centreline of the existing road formation (S133). The gate shall be located to one side of the stock grid and be clear of the normal travel path of a vehicle. A number of commercially available stock grids (refer to SD106) have been approved by Council for use on roads under the care and control of Council. Such stock grids range from 4.0 metres to 8.4 metres in width, the width required being determined by the category of road on which the grid is to be installed.

It should also be noted that the acceptance of a PSGG Application by Council does not constitute any form of contract or guarantee that the PSGG application and installation will be approved. The application will be subject to assessment by Council's Engineering staff to ensure the site will allow the installation to comply with current road design standards.

After receipt of your application, a public notice is placed in the local newspaper seeking submissions. During the advertising period, Council's Engineering staff will carry out an inspection of the site. Submissions relating to the application will be accepted for a period of 28 days. Submissions may need to be resolved by the applicant. Council will advise whether your application may proceed and if any additional conditions apply to the installation.

If you wish to continue with the installation, you are then required to lodge a Application to carry out a Section 138 road activity.

This application relates to Section 138 of the Roads Act. On receipt of the Minor Works Application, Council will then advertise in the local newspaper that the PSGG Permit Application has been approved subject to satisfactory installation. Following satisfactory installation of the grid and gate, Council will issue the PSGG Permit.

In summary, you will be required to:

- 1. Lodge the PSGG Application, including the written consent of owners of adjacent property not owned by the applicant. Note that lodging an application binds you as a 'debtor' to pay any costs associated with the application, the installation, maintenance and future removal of the grid and gate.
- 2. May have to resolve to Council's satisfaction any objection lodged.
- 3. On notification by Council that the grid and gate installation may proceed, you are required to lodge a Application to carry out a Section 138 road activity.

INDICATIVE COSTS

The minimum cost of a 4.2 metre wide grid for a Category 1 road to Council's minimum standard is approximately \$6,000 (includes the grid, gate, guard-rails and required signage). However, this amount does not include installation costs, which will vary depending on the site conditions. It also does not include the concrete footings that would be required for some approved grids.
