On our roads and bridges

Keep an eye out for our maintenance and construction crews in these areas:

- Bulahdelah Lee Street Reconstruction from Crawford to Stroud Street and 175m of Stroud Street / Markwell Road. Works are currently scheduled to finish in early September.
- Esplanade, North Arm Cove Scope of works include upgrading of stormwater drainage - new stormwater culvert and upgrades to pipes under driveways, reconstruction of 350m of gravel road from the eastern end of The Esplanade to create a new bitumen sealed road. Recent rain has delayed completion of the drainage system.
- The Lakes Way, Pacific Palms Rehabilitation at the intersection of Boomerang Drive. Works were largely completed last week. Linemarking to be completed this week along with other minor works.
- Booral Road, Crawford River Bitumen sealing is programmed for this week, linemarking to follow.
