If you're a keen 4WD'er, now's the time to renew your beach vehicle access permit, which gives you the freedom to explore the coastline from a different perspective.

Annual permits are valid 1 July 2018 - 30 June 2019. A 30 day permit is also available for less frequent users.

### On our roads and bridges

Keep an eye out for our maintenance and construction crews in these areas:

- Bulahdelah Lee Street reconstruction from Crawford Street to Stroud Street and 175m of Stroud Street/Markwell Road. Works have resumed in a positive manner with a strong commitment from contractors to complete the works, currently programmed to finish early September.
- Esplanade, North Arm Cove Reconstruction of 350m of gravel road from eastern end of The Esplanade to create a new bitumen sealed road. Recent rain has delayed completion of the drainage system. Works on reconstruction will follow.
- The Lakes Way, Pacific Palms rehabilitation at the intersection of Boomerang Drive. Pavement works due for completion this week, weather permitting.
- Booral Road, Crawford River Reconstruction of 900m of Booral Road. Preparation for works on road pavement are largely complete. Recent wet weather has delayed commencement of the next phase. Current completion is programmed for mid July.
