Bulky waste collection

The scrap metal and bulky waste clean-up will take place again this year, this time extending across the entire region. It kicked off on Monday 30 April for residents in the Great Lakes region, with Manning to follow from 18 June, and Gloucester from 6 August.

This is a great opportunity to dispose of those larger, unwanted items around the house or in the shed, and have them conveniently picked up from the kerbside where your regular bins are usually placed for collection.

Waste items must be sorted into two separate piles – one for scrap metal (such as pushbikes, whitegoods with doors removed, or empty paint tins with lids removed), and the other for general bulky waste (such as broken furniture, small appliances or floor coverings). There are strict guidelines around what items will be accepted, and how your waste must be presented for collection - please check our website to ensure your bulky waste piles comply, as non-compliant waste will not be picked up.

You should check the date for collection in your specific zone, and place your waste out according to the schedule - no earlier, as this will be considered illegal dumping and you could be fined.

All scrap metal collected will be recycled, however all general bulky waste will be sent to landfill so please consider if your items could be re-used by someone else and try and find a new home for them instead.
