Council elections

It's not long until we hit the polls, so now's the time to start thinking about who will best represent our community as a MidCoast Councillor. We're 90,000 people spread over 10,000km², so the newly elected councillors will take on an enormous responsibility to manage Council's \$320million pa business in a way that delivers value and equity to all.

John Turner, our Administrator since the merger, firmly believes that success relies on Councillors thinking strategically, over a long period, for the whole of the Council area. "Councillors are there to represent the community. Many people stand for Council on a single local issue or to deliver what a particular section of the public wants, but for Council to operate effectively, parochialism is counter-productive. It's the whole of Council's activities that have to be considered" John said.

The dissolution of MidCoast Water and integration into MidCoast Council was proclaimed by the NSW Government, effective 1 July. This means we've created a fifth business unit, Water Services, to enable the on-going delivery of services in a "business as usual" manner for our customers. 

\$30M Roadcare Program

Made up of merger funding and savings, the program is part of our commitment to improving infrastructure across the region and has already contributed to significant progress on some of our key transport routes. Of an initial \$4million that has been allocated we have:

- Completed a \$1million resealing program
- Undertaken \$750,000 worth of urgent bridge repairs
- Progressed reconstruction of Combined and Dennes Sts, Wingham
- Contributed to Diamond Beach Road works, currently underway
- Allocated funding to works soon to commence on Harrington Road

The Roadcare Program will continue to target our immediate priorities, but alone will not address the \$5 million annual shortfall for funding renewals of our transport assets, and the backlog that currently sits at \$180million. The condition of our roads and bridges remains one of our highest priorities.
