# **KEEPING OUR KIDS SAFE**

With the new school term starting, make sure you slow down to 40km/h in school zones and when bus lights flash.



The 40km/h school zone signs flash to protect children when they are on their way to and from schools. This means they're in force every weekday morning and afternoon, except public holidays and

publicly notified government school holidays.

Lights also flash on the front and back of buses when they pick up or set down children to indicate they are preparing to stop, and that children are on foot around them.

Younger children are still developing the skills to judge the sound, speed, and direction of vehicles, so they can be unpredictable and at risk of collision within minutes of stepping off a bus.

We can all help to keep local kids safe as they head back to school by:

- slowing down to 40km/h when school zone signs and bus lights flash
- looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones or along bus routes, including rural roads where bus stops are harder to see
- giving way to buses as they merge back into traffic.

# Dropping kids off?

It's important to understand where you can and can't stop around schools. Know the signs that are in place

to avoid congestion, confusion and danger to school kids during peak times.
