



Keeping our community up to date

In November 2013 we adopted an Environmental Action Plan which was developed in close consultation with the community to identify local environmental issues of concern. To help fund the projects in the plan, an environmental levy in the form of a special rate variation was also introduced in July 2014 for a period of 5 years.

The levy will raise just over \$1.3 million dollars each year for projects that address a range of issues grouped under the following themes: Estuary and Water Quality; Biodiversity; Sustainability and Environmental Performance; Dredging and Foreshore Improvements.

What we've been up to



Estuary and Water Quality

- We stabilised over 1km of severely eroding riverbanks on the Manning River at Pelican Bay, Harrington and Taree through a combination of rock filleting and revetment.
- We engaged the UNSW Water Research Laboratory to undertake an assessment of the Manning River floodplain to identify priority areas requiring the remediation of acid sulfate soils.
- We completed the winter sampling for the Sand Tracing Study at Old Bar Beach.



Biodiversity

- We completed an intensive 6 month environmental restoration project at Cattai Wetlands with the assistance of a 10-person Green Army Team funded through the Federal government.
- We completed stage 1 of the Schoolhouse Gully project at Wingham in partnership with Manning Landcare to regenerate a weed infested tributary of Cedar Party Creek.
- We erected over 600m of stock exclusion fencing on private land fronting Browns
 Creek to improve water quality and to protect endangered plant communities.
- We partnered with Hallidays Point Landcare to help control the spread of Asparagus weeds within the littoral rainforest.



Dredging and Foreshore Improvements

- We commenced the survey and design for the upgrade of the Bohnock Boat Ramp.
- We partnered with Tidy up Taree to upgrade the public amenities at the Endeavour Place Boat Ramp.
- We constructed new public amenities at Harry Bennett Park to enhance the community's use of the Manning River foreshore.



We won!

We won a Green Globe Award, in partnership with the UNSW Water Research Laboratory (WRL), in the Natural Environment Sustainability category for the Big Swamp project.

The Green Globe Awards are the NSW Government's leading environmental recognition program, celebrating excellence, leadership and innovation in sustainability.



Sustainability and Environmental Performance

- We engaged the NSW
 Office of Environment
 & Heritage to conduct
 the annual water quality
 monitoring program within
 the Manning River estuary.
- We engaged NSW Public Works to undertake an investigation to determine whether the processes affecting the dynamics of the two Manning River entrances are having an effect on beach erosion occurring at Old Bar and Manning Point.





Projects Update

Funding Success

One of the benefits of the environmental levy is that it enables us to attract additional funding from the State and Federal governments, as most grant programs require the applicant to provide matching funding. As of 31 December 2015 we have been successful in receiving an additional \$2 million in external funding to assist in implementing environmental projects funded through the levy. Those granted during the last 6 months (just over \$355,000) which will be matched dollar for dollar through the environmental levy include:

\$200,000

through the **NSW Estuary Management Program** for Stage 3 of the Big Swamp Acid Sulfate Soil Remediation Project.

\$70,000

through the **NSW Estuary Management Program** to undertake further restoration of actively eroding riverbanks within the Manning River estuary.

\$76,565

through the **NSW Fish Habitat Action Grant Program** for two riverbank stabilisation projects on the Manning River at Oxley and Dumaresq Islands.

\$5,000

through the **NSW Recreational Fishing Trust** to install a new fish cleaning table at the Bohnock boat ramp.

4 x 10

Four 10-person teams via the **Federal Green Army Program** to undertake weed removal and tree planting, boardwalk construction, water quality monitoring and fauna surveys within Council's bushland reserves.

Future Projects

Applications for matching funding of \$176,575 (over three years) have also been submitted to the NSW Environmental Trust Restoration and Rehabilitation Program to protect and enhance degraded lowland and littoral rainforest remnants across the region.
