'Pool Safe' self assessment tool

This is a **<u>guide only</u>** and does not cover all aspects of an inspection.

It does cover the most common reasons for non-compliance in home pools.

Does your pool meet child safety standards?

Pool Registration Is your pool registered on the NSW Swimming Pool Register? This is required by law and can be done by visiting www.swimmingpoolregister.nsw.gov.au or at Council Climbable Objects Your pool fence must be clear of any objects such as BBQs, trees, rocks, shrubs and deckchairs that could help a small child climb over the fence Gates Pool gate opens away from the pool Pool gate self-closes and self-latches from all open positions **Pool Fences** The height of the pool fence is at least 1200mm measured from the outside of the fence The gap between the bottom of the fence and the gate to the ground is no more than 100mm. The ground under the fence and gate must be permanent, not sand, soil, woodchip or gravel If a boundary fence forms part of the pool barrier, it must be at least 1800mm high measured on the inside of the fence The pool fence has horizontal rails no closer than 900mm apart The pool fence has vertical rails no greater than 100mm apart The pool fence is well maintained and fixed securely Resuscitation (CPR) Chart There is an appropriate warning sign, including details of resuscitation (CPR) techniques, in the immediate vicinity of the pool area which can be read at a
