Policy objective

The objectives of this policy are:

- To maintain the road network at a level that is safe for use by the community.
- To ensure the road network is maintained to an agreed service standard.
- To ensure the maintenance activities on Transport Assets are well managed with available funding.

Policy statement

Council is committed to maintaining a safe road network and encouraging the use of alternate transport through the provision of a safe, accessible and connected walking and cycling network.

Council is committed to sustainably managing waste through reduction, reuse, recycling and repurposing and its relationship with transport asset maintenance.

Policy coverage

MidCoast Council maintains a road network of approximately 3645km of sealed and unsealed roads. The road network includes 669 bridges. Other assets such as culverts, footpaths, bicycle tracks, traffic facilities, line-marking, guideposts, signage and kerb/guttering all form Transport Assets.

This policy covers all staff undertaking maintenance on Councils Transport Assets network.

Policy content

Council provides a network of roads, bridges, stormwater drainage, drainage structures, footpaths and cycling network as detailed in Councils Transport Assets - Asset Register.

A risk management approach has been adopted for the maintenance of these assets through a systematic method of inspection, identification, evaluation and prioritisation of defects on the network.
