New rules for pets going to new homes



If you're selling or giving away a dog or cat, after 1 July this year, the rules have changed.

People advertising kittens, cats, puppies and dogs for sale or to give away in NSW will need to include an identification number in advertisements.

The identification number can be a microchip number, a breeder identification number, or a rehoming organisation number and is designed to help people looking to buy a cat or dog search the NSW Pet Registry to see the animal's breed, sex, age, whether it's desexed, whether or not it's registered and whether any annual permit is in place.
