Biripi Way DA - Have Your Say



The development application for repurposing 2 Biripi Way Taree into Council's centralised office is on public exhibition. Community members are invited to review the plans and application documents (including statement of environmental effects, economic impact assessment and traffic impact assessment) and make a submission before 4.30pm on Wednesday 6 December.

Please refer to information provided on our website (www.midcoast.nsw.gov.au/hvs) about how to make a submission, and include reasons for your support or objection to the application. Reasons should be based on planning and development issues relevant to the application, such as impacts on the environment, traffic movements, or local businesses.

Stroud Showground improvements begin

Preparation works are now underway for the new multi-purpose building at Stroud Showground.

The new building will be located on the site of the current public amenities block which has been fenced off for tree clearing, services disconnection and demolition.

The demolition will also mean some existing campsites will not be available for use going forward.

The multi-purpose building combines a number of facilities previously located throughout the showground and is part of the restoration of the showground following damage sustained by flood in 2015.

A local contractor is completing the works and there are alternate amenities available to use, meaning there will be minimal impact on showground users.

The public should be aware that the project site will remain closed until the completion of the multi-purpose building which is expected to be around April 2020.
