



Community Donations

Community groups play a vital role in strengthening our local communities.

Whether it's by bringing people together, improving local facilities, providing training and skill development, or something else altogether, you may be eligible to apply for funding through our Community Donations program.

Annual donations

Apply for up to \$2,000 to support your community development or capacity-building projects and activities, or to assist with purchasing equipment that will help to deliver them.

Seed funding program

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to support your group in getting a community initiative off-the-ground, and becoming self-sustaining over a 2 year period.

Applicants must meet eligibility criteria and provide full details and costings with their application. Our Small Donations Program offers up to \$150 for minor projects/purchases and applications are accepted year-round. Our recurrent Donations Program is open to select organisations on application.

Event Sponsorship

Not only do local events connect our vibrant communities, they help put us on the map, attracting visitors and building our economy!

From art shows and music festivals, to sporting events, food, fashion and everything in between, our events are a celebration of what the MidCoast is all about.

Depending on the scale of your event, four categories of funding are offered in the sponsorship program:

- Community event:** Up to \$2,000
- Medium event:** \$2,000 - \$5,000
- Large event:** \$5,000 - \$10,000
- Iconic event:** \$10,000+

Eligibility criteria applies. Carols by Candlelight, Anzac Day and Australia Day events are managed separately. Our Event Sponsorship Interim Policy is currently open for feedback - see below for details on how you can have your say.



Local Heritage Fund

Preserving our region's heritage and breathing new life into buildings and places from our past is a great way to enhance the character and charm our local communities are known for.

Your heritage place may need a coat of paint, restoration of its decorative features, stone or brick facade work, roof restorations, window repair or replacement, or fencing reflective of its era.

As custodians of an important part of our region's history, you may be eligible to apply for up to \$2,000 to help restore your heritage place back to its former glory.

Eligibility criteria extended

As well as applicants who own heritage-listed properties, this year the Local Heritage Fund is available to owners of properties within the 14 heritage conservation areas across the MidCoast.

Eligibility criteria applies, and full details and costings must be provided in your application. Funding must be at least 50% of the total project cost. In some exceptional cases applicants may apply for up to \$5,000.

The next Ordinary meeting of Council will be held at the Forster Administration Centre, Wednesday 10 April at 2pm.

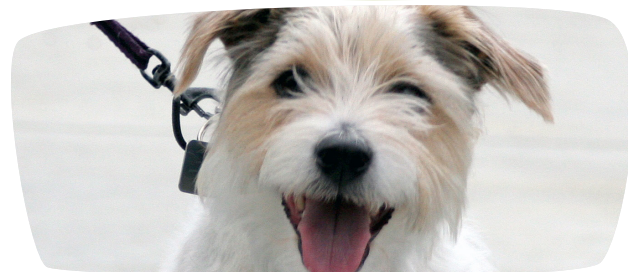
As always, you may submit a request to address the meeting on any item listed on the agenda.

Resealing our roads is like adding a protective layer of polish to your car. Our crews have been busy in the Forster, Tea Gardens and Hawks Nest areas, with an extensive reseal program that will continue over the coming months.

Event sponsorship policy

We have developed a new interim sponsorship policy to support the provision of event sponsorship within the MidCoast region.

This policy applies to monetary (cash) sponsorship and in-kind support made by Council to eligible applicants for the delivery of events. The key items to note include:

- There are now two (2) opportunities to apply for event sponsorship each year with application closure dates being indicated within the policy.
- There are four (4) levels of sponsorship available; and
- Events will be assessed against a specific list of selection criteria contained in the policy.

The draft Policy is now on public exhibition and is open for feedback until 10 May.
