Notice of Intended Pesticide Application

We have instructed Local Pest Experts to carry out pesticide applications in the Great Lakes Region, which are scheduled to be carried out during from 1 April to 31 May.

Pesticides are being used for ants, spiders and cockroaches. Pesticide products will be applied to buildings throughout MidCoast Council's Forster Branch area. Pesticides used will be selected from the following products: Biflex Aguamax insecticide, Synergy Pro ant bait, Starrdust Pro, Maxforce Gold Gel, Enviromax Deltamethrin, Temprid 75, Termidor,

Residents (including pets) are advised not to enter the premises through any treated areas until the pesticides used have dried, or any special instructions advised on the notice erected on the dav(s) of treatment.

Bushfire Recovery - Waiver of fees & charges



Anyone who lost their home in the recent bushfires is eligible for a range of exemptions from rates and Council fees and charges. Council has waived all fees and charges for the rebuilding of homes destroyed by the bushfires, and a range of other fee exemptions are in place.
