### Mobile recycling trailer - Black Head

Our Mobile Recycling trailer is heading around the region, with its next stop at Black Head (Wylie Breckenridge Park) next Thursday, 27 June from 8am to 10am.

The trailer allows residents to dispose of hazardous problem waste items, including gas bottles, paint, motor oils, car batteries, household batteries, fluoro globes and tubes, smoke detectors and fire extinguishers.

Please be aware the trailer may leave a site earlier than advertised if it reaches capacity.

Note, these problem household waste items can be dropped at your nearest Community Recycling Centre at any time for free.

### Bulky waste clean-up

It's great news with the annual bulky waste and scrap metal clean-up soon to take place in a location near you. Our contractors have just completed the Great Lakes region and will head into the Manning region from Monday 24 June.

This is a great opportunity to dispose of those larger, unwanted items around the house or in the shed, and have them conveniently picked up from the kerbside where your regular bins are usually placed for collection.

Waste items must be sorted into two separate piles – one for scrap metal and whitegoods (such as pushbikes, fridges and washing machines with doors removed, or empty paint tins with lids removed), and the other for general bulky waste and eWaste (such as broken furniture, small appliances, floor coverings or TVs, computers, mobile phones). There are strict guidelines around what items will be accepted, and how your waste must be presented for collection – please check our website to ensure your bulky waste piles comply, as non-compliant waste will not be picked up.

You should check the date for collection in your specific zone, and place your waste out according to the schedule – no earlier, as this will be considered illegal dumping and you could be fined.

All scrap metal collected will be recycled, however all general bulky waste will be sent to landfill so please consider if your items could be re-used by someone else and try and find a new home for them instead.

### Victoria Street roadworks



Rehabilitation works commenced this week on a section of Victoria St Taree, between Commerce and Flett Sts. For the safety of road users and crews, the Victoria St / Commerce St intersection is closed off to through traffic for the duration of the works, with clearly marked detours in place. To minimise disruption, the works will be undertaken in two stages and we are liaising with local residents in the work zone to assist in accessing their properties.

It is anticipated the project will be completed over 12 weeks, weather permitting, and the road re-opened to traffic with a temporary seal in mid-September. The contractor will return in early December to place the final seal and line marking.

The outcome will be a smoother, safer and more durable road surface in this busy part of Taree's CBD, along with replacement kerb and guttering and improved drainage.
