COMMUNITY FUNDING

Applications open Monday 8 April



Community groups play a vital role in strengthening our local communities.

Whether it's by bringing people together, improving local facilities, providing training and skill development, or something else altogether, you may be eligible to apply for funding through our Community Donations program.

Annual donations

Apply for up to \$2,000 to support your community development or capacity-building projects and activities, or to assist with purchasing equipment that will help to deliver them.

Seed funding program

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to support your group in getting a community initiative off-the-ground, and becoming self-sustaining over a 2 year period.

Applicants must meet eligibility criteria and provide full details and costings with their application. Our Small Donations Program offers up to \$150 for minor projects/purchases and applications are accepted year-round. Our recurrent Donations Program is open to select organisations on application.

Event Sponsorship

As custodians of an important part of our region's history, you may be eligible to apply for up to \$2,000 to help restore your heritage place back to its former glory.

Eligibility criteria extended

THE OLD BAKERY

As well as applicants who own heritage-listed properties, this year the Local Heritage Fund is available to owners of properties within the 14 heritage conservations areas across the MidCoast.

Eligibility criteria applies, and full details and costings must be provided in your application. Funding must be at least 50% of the total project cost. In some exceptional cases applicants may apply for up to \$5,000.

Mobile Recycling Trailer - Coopernook

Our Mobile Recycling trailer is heading around the region, with its next stop at Coopernook at the reserve outside the Coopernook Hotel next Thursday, 11 April from 8am to 10am.

The trailer allows residents to dispose of hazardous problem waste items, including gas bottles, paint, motor oils, car batteries, household batteries, fluoro globes and tubes, smoke detectors and fire extinguishers.

On our roads

Commencing next week and continuing through to September, a 1.4km section of The Bucketts Way at Tinonee will be targeted for rehabilitation. Stretching from Manchester Street through to Peg Leg Creek, lanes will be widened, the existing road pavement rehabilitated, road shoulders added and improvements made to roadside drainage. Lane closures and detours will be required at times, with temporary traffic lights in operation to manage traffic

As always, motorists are asked to observe all roadworks signage, reduced speed limits and directions from road crews. The project will provide improved safety outcomes for users of The Bucketts Way, and is part of our focus on improving the roads that connect our communities.

We have developed a new interim sponsorship policy to support the provision of event sponsorship within the MidCoast region. This policy applies to monetary (cash) sponsorship and in-kind support made by Council to eligible applicants for the delivery of events. The key items to note include:

- There are now two (2) opportunities to apply for event sponsorship each year with application closure dates being indicated within the policy.
- There are four (4) levels of sponsorship available; and
- Events will be assessed against a specific list of selection criteria contained in the policy.
