Bushfire Recovery - Waiver of fees & charges

Anyone who lost their home in the recent bushfires is eligible for a range of exemptions from rates and Council fees and charges.

Council has waived all fees and charges for the rebuilding of homes destroyed by the bushfires, and a range of other fee exemptions are in place. To be eligible your property must have been identified by the RFS building impact assessment team as damaged or destroyed.

COVID-19 - Closures

We are temporarily changing the way we deliver our services, in line with Federal and State Government measures to reduce the spread of the virus in the community. While essential services will continue, the following closures are now in place:

- Taree Regional Airport terminal (with Fly Pelican suspending all flights)

Please note, while our Gloucester administration centre is closed for face-to-face Council transactions. Service NSW and Services Australia (Centrelink) continue to open at this location from 10am daily.

Anti-gathering restrictions

Strict limits on public gatherings are now in place, and current social distancing rules should be observed when using public areas such as beaches, parks and public amenities. Please be aware that public amenities may be closed at short notice where they cannot be maintained and restocked appropriately.

Essential services continue
