Bulky waste

The annual bulky waste and scrap metal kerbside collection is back this year, currently collecting in the Manning region. The message is loud and clear – don't put your waste out any earlier than specified for your zone or you may be fined.

Beach permits

With Easter holidays approaching, it is a timely reminder that our beach permits are available to purchase from our customer service centres or one of our authorised re-sellers.

Obtaining a MidCoast Council beach access vehicle permit gives you entry to a range of beautiful, unspoilt beaches in both the Manning and Great Lakes regions.

By obtaining a permit you are also agreeing to comply with rules regarding where and when you can access the beach.

Please note: the beach vehicle access point at Kylie's Beach Campground is closed due to erosion in this area and unsafe driving conditions. Signage will be in place at Kylie's Campground, as well as at Crowdy Bay's access point.

Development proposal-self contained camping

The Tuncurry Sporties Club has lodged an application to create a camp area for self-contained RVs and trailers on land around the existing club facility.

The application proposes 37 sites for the parking of registered moveable dwellings. The sites are proposed to be established on existing grassland areas and will generally be 12m x 5m.

There will also be five double-sized spaces (24m x 5m) for longer moveable dwellings.

Community donations

Our Community Donations round opened on 1 March, one of our competitive funding opportunities we offer each year.

Community Donations funding rounds are administered under Council's Community Donations Policy which invites not-forprofit organisations to apply for funding to deliver communitydevelopment and capacity-building projects and activities. Applications for the 2021/22 Donations Program close on Saturday 27 March.

Local Heritage Fund

Anyone across the MidCoast who owns a heritage listed place or property within a heritage conservation area, may be eligible for a grant through the Local Heritage Fund.

The Local Heritage Fund aims to preserve the region's heritage while breathing new life into buildings and places from our past.

Some examples of the work that could be completed with the heritage grant funding include repairing front fences, replacing guttering and fascia board, external painting, replacement of roofing and repairs to windows and verandahs.
