A mobile collection program will roll out again in 2022, to make it easy for boaties to dispose of their expired flares.

The RMS program offers convenient and free disposal of marine flares that have reached expiry. Flares contain hazardous materials that must be disposed of correctly.

The mobile collection points will be at three locations in the MidCoast on 10 January 2022:

- Taree - Queen Elizabeth Park 7.30am - 9.30am
- Crowdy Head boat ramp 11am - 1pm
- Forster boat ramp 2.30pm - 4.30pm

Collections will also take place in April and June 2022.
