Find out when Bulky Waste is coming to your neighbourhood.

With the Bulky Waste collection taking about 4 months to cover our entire region, it's important to put your waste out on the date specified for your location – no earlier or you could be fined.

Residents of the following locations are invited to place waste out this weekend, 18/19 March:

Brimbin, Coopernook, Coralville, Croki, Crowdy Head, Ghinni Ghinni, Hannam Vale, Harrington, Johns River, Jones Island, Kundle Kundle, Langley Vale, Lansdowne, Lansdowne Forest, Melinga, Moorland, Moto, Stewarts River, Upper Lansdowne and Waitui.
