MidCoast Water Services


MidCoast Water Services (now a division of MidCoast Council) is continuing to provide the same high quality services you received from MidCoast Water.

Working with the NSW Government and local business community, we are currently developing a strategy which will strengthen our economy, help us attract funding towards economic projects and encourage jobs growth across the MidCoast.

SETTING UP FOR SUCCESS

Our priority since merger has been establishing sound management practices and robust strategies that help us deliver high quality, value-for-money outcomes across the MidCoast region.

This has included working closely with the State Government, and placing our \$180 million infrastructure backlog firmly in the spotlight.

The recent approval of the Special Rate Variation will enable Council to borrow \$50 million as additional funding for our roads and bridges. One of our main focus areas since merger has been to work in partnership with the State Government to set MidCoast Council up for success. This includes developing strategies that support our long term financial sustainability and address our asset backlog.

We are currently negotiating with the NSW Government on a proposal that would see them commit to a matching \$50 million contribution towards MidCoast roads and bridges, enabling a total package of \$100 million additional funding to address the asset renewal and backlog challenges. This additional funding was not available previously and will allow us to honour our commitment to our community to improve local infrastructure in a sustainable and responsible manner.
